Dear Secretary Hegseth,

We write to express our serious concern regarding the announcement that the Department of Defense will remove 700 U.S. service members from Romania on NATO's Eastern Flank. With the war in Ukraine still raging, this move undermines U.S. commitments to Europe and the broader transatlantic alliance. It also undermines President Trump's own commitment to achieving a durable peace in Ukraine.

Since February 2022, Vladimir Putin has waged a brutal war of aggression in Ukraine. In response, the United States has led a global coalition of allies in bolstering Ukraine's defense while also strengthening NATO's resolve and ability to defend itself against a variety of hybrid and kinetic attacks by the Kremlin. Most recently, Russia's drone incursion into Poland, its overflights of Estonian and Romanian territory, and its use of hybrid warfare against NATO demonstrate that this threat is enduring.

As NATO has strengthened its deterrence, including by agreeing to a 5% of GDP commitment for defense spending, Romania has consistently met NATO requirements and served as a robust and fully capable host for U.S. service members. Alongside contributions to Black Sea defense and its hosting of a U.S. Aegis Ashore missile defense detachment, Bucharest has demonstrated continued resolve in support of NATO's collective defense.

As the administration seeks to secure a lasting peace in Ukraine, we believe it is vital that the United States show strength in the face of Russian aggression. Removing hundreds of U.S. troops from NATO's Eastern Flank as the war in Ukraine rages undermines our bipartisan hope to see the end of the war in Ukraine on Ukraine's terms. This decision provides further ammunition to the Kremlin, which seeks to show that the United States is retreating from Europe just as Ukraine and Europe are most in need of continued U.S. support.

We strongly urge a reconsideration of this decision and an explanation to Congress and the relevant Committees about how the Pentagon intends to bolster the transatlantic relationship and continue its commitments to the NATO alliance
